Thank you to Ian Bridge for arranging the Workshop “Keeping you and your money safe’ on Tuesday on behalf of the Older Person’s committee. The Workshop was presented by Brent Neilson from Age Concern and gave some tips and what to look out for.

Some of the things Brent covered were Financial Abuse, Scams and Online safety. Of Elder abuse 75% is by family members. Last year \$33 million was lost by New Zealanders in scams. 56% by people over 65years but it can happen to anyone.

Scammers trap people when they are most vulnerable, so it is important to

- Set up an enduring power of attorney
- Make a will
- Have an advance care plan
- Talk to your family about your wishes
- Regularly check your privacy settings on Facebook.
- Update your apps and antivirus regularly
- check at the bottom of emails to see where they have come from
