Eco Corner

The Para Kore focus for this quarter is '*The Pathways of Reuse*'. They aim to empower communities to choose the pathway of reusing; rather than buying single-use products which trick us into perpetually buying into a consumeristic system of 'take, make and throwaway'.

'Single use' is a relatively new concept. Only 40 years ago milk was delivered to our letterboxes and if you were lucky to your doorstep, in glass bottles. Every night these were exchanged, those empty glass bottles collected to be washed and refilled and replaced by a fresh glass bottle of milk. Nowadays, we have to go to the shop and buy plastic bottles of milk that when finished are put (ideally) in the recycling bin and may have one more shot at life, being downcycled in an energy-intensive, pollution creating process to make one more plastic thing, which is then sent to landfill. Recycling in most cases (not all), although better than the rubbish bin, is ultimately a false solution.

When we take our own cup to the coffee shop, when we sew on a lost button, when we take our own lunch box to the sushi shop, when we cover our kai with a plate, lid or teatowel instead of cling film, or when we use real plates instead of compostable plates, we are, in a subtle way, exercising mana motuhake. That's because reuse is helping us to become independent, and less reliant on buying more and more shit, over and over again. When we buy less single-use crap, we are saying no to the extractive and exploitative systems that put constant pressure on our whānau atua and our global whānau. We also save pūtea by choosing to reuse what we already have, rather than buying something we can only use once.

Not only does 'reuse' save money and resources but it is also climate action, reducing emissions. In these times of hardship, become conscious of what you are buying. Is it single-use, is it reuse? Kei a koe te mana, kei a tātou te mana. Our individual and collective efforts make a huge impact.
