Enjoy a cuppa, scone and chat while you wait.


Please pray for the process of finding a new minister for Chartwell Cooperating Church, that God's choice will be clear.

### Eco Corner - From Para Kore June Newsletter (Matariki)

This year's Matariki theme - set by Professor Rangi Mātāmua - is 'Matariki Heri Kai'. It's an encouragement for whānau to grow, harvest, and gather kai from local, traditional food landscapes; to honour our whakapapa, our tupuna and te taiao whether that be the ngahere (bush), moana (sea) or maara kai (garden).

Knowing the whakapapa of our food that we eat or serve our manuhiri connects us with the mana and mauri of kai. He mana to te kai. He mauri to te kai.

We welcome you all, Māori and Tangata Tiriti alike, to lean in and celebrate Matariki. It is a time to connect, reflect, share kai, immerse ourselves in te taiao, remember those who have passed on and set our intentions for the year ahead.

We have seen some korero circulating recently promoting the release of helium balloons this Matariki, in remembrance of those who have passed on. Balloons are made of plastic and don't decompose, they eventually break into smaller and smaller pieces - microplastics. But before they do that they can travel hundreds or even thousands of miles killing wildlife ngā tamariki a Tāne, (birds and insects) and ngā tamaraki a Tangaroa (creatures of the sea). At Para Kore, they gently encourage remembrance of loved ones in a way that honours our whakapapa to atua Māori, to the natural world that we belong to.

Alternatively, you could...

Plant a native rakau

Cultivate a remembrance garden

Make a photo album

Say a prayer or sing a waiata

Visit a special place you shared.

Sit down with your friends and whānau and have a kai tahi, enjoy each other's company and share pūrākau of those who have passed to keep those precious memories alive.

Ngā whetū katoa o te kāhui Matariki - all the stars of Matariki - serve as reminders of our interconnectedness to te ao tūroa. Just as it is a time to remember our loved ones, it is also a time to deepen our connections and understanding of our atua Māori, in turn deepening our connection with ourselves and those around us.
