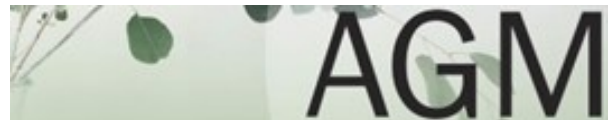

## **Eco Corner—**

### **the hidden environmental cost of cloud storage Part Two**

Servers and hardware inside data centres don't last forever. Eventually, they wear out, become outdated, or break down. When that happens, they turn into electronic waste, or e-waste, which often ends up in landfills. The rapid pace of technology means data centres constantly upgrade, generating even more waste year after year.

Water plays a crucial role in keeping data centres running. Servers generate a tremendous amount of heat, and most big data centres use water-cooled systems to prevent them from overheating. Some facilities can use millions of gallons of water each day—enough to supply a small town. In places already struggling with drought or limited water resources, this extra demand can put incredible pressure on local communities and ecosystems.

Most people don't realize they have power as consumers. Every extra photo, video, or email stored in the cloud adds to the demand for storage space and energy. Regularly cleaning out old files, deleting duplicates, and thinking twice before uploading, can help reduce your digital footprint.
