Eco Corner— **Community Corner** (Talk to Sylvia to have items here from your group)

An excerpt from this week's A Rocha Aotearoa NZ

Kia ora e te whānau whānui o A Rocha,

Whoever decided that the Season of Creation would be at this time of year was on to something. While the Northern Hemisphere moves into autumn, here in Aotearoa spring is bursting with life. As I see the kōwhai bloom, I'm reminded of the goodness of God's creation – and that God invites the Church to care for it. And honestly? I'm blown away by what's been happening through A Rocha here in Aotearoa.

This year alone, the Eco Church network has been spreading faster than a kumara patch. Over 100 churches across the motu are now part of the movement — discovering that creation care isn't an optional extra, but central to following Jesus. And this Season of Creation has been especially full — for eco churches and also our staff team. Right across Aotearoa, churches have hosted creative gatherings, outdoor worship events, planting sessions, speaker events and more — drawing people together to celebrate the goodness of God's world. Five more churches even joined the Eco Church whānau during September alone! It's been incredible to see communities putting down roots and living out Good News for all the earth.

And while Eco Church is the new kid on the block, A Rocha has deep roots in this kaupapa. Think of the Karioi Project, where years of persistent trapping and planting have meant seabirds returning to breed on the mountain. Or the local groups around the country – ordinary people rolling up their sleeves week after week to restore rivers, wetlands, and forests. This is what faithfulness looks like over time.

Here's the thing: this work only happens because people like you believe it matters. And it does matter – for the gospel, for our neighbours, and for creation itself.

Together, we're showing that following Jesus really is Good News for all the earth.
