International E-Waste Day

International E-Waste Day is an annual event celebrated on October 14th to raise awareness of the growing problem of elec-tronic waste (e-waste) and to promote the safe and responsible management of e-waste. It was first celebrated in 2018 by the Waste from Electrical and Electronic Equipment Forum, a global network of organizations working to reduce e-waste. The date of October 14th was chosen because it is the deadline for developed countries to com-

The date of October 14th was chosen because it is the deadline for developed countries to comply with the Basel Convention's Amendment on e-waste. The Basel Convention is an international treaty regulating hazardous waste's transboundary movement.

In 2019, the world generated 53.6 million tonnes of e-waste. Only 20% of this e-waste was recycled in an environmentally sound manner. The remaining 80% was either landfilled, incinerated, or illegally dumped.

E-waste contains hazardous materials, such as lead, mercury, and cadmium. These materials can pollute the environment and harm human health. burned or buried, releasing hazardous materials into the environment.

New Minister of Chartwell Cooperating Church (St Albans) announced

It is with great pleasure that we announce the appointment of the Reverend Peter Bargh as the next Minister of Chartwell Cooperating Church. Peter, Kahu and family are well known to the people of Chartwell Cooperating Church, living very close by and regularly supporting St Albans. We know this appointment will be widely welcomed. Peter will initially be appointed to a 0.8 EFT position as he will continue as the Archdeacon for Tauranga and the Bay of Plenty in the Diocese of Waiapu. Because of his current responsibilities Peter will not formally take up the role until the beginning of 2026 but will begin some very limited ministry under a Letter of Authority from 14 November 2025. His next Sunday service will be on the 7th of December 2025. Our prayers are with Peter, his family, and the leadership and people of the Parish of Chartwell as this important new beginning approaches.
