Messy Church

This month's Messy Church focus was on peacefulness and remembrance. We reflected on ANZAC day and on what peacefulness means for us today. The craft below was making 'stained glass' poppies for our windows of red poppies. You can see a couple of them on a window in the Hall.



ANZAC cookies are something many of us associate with ANZAC day and at Messy Church we made a basic ANZAC biscuit dough and then encouraged attendees to make it their own. This was a popular activity and we cooked some very fun & interesting biscuits.

One of the other activities was making symbols of peace out of dough and another was a memory game with symbols of peace. We also made doves.
